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Introduction

The present bibliography was prepared in the context of *The MacColl Project*, a project initiated by Michael Astroh, Greifswald University, in 1996 to research and publish the works of the Scottish logician Hugh MacColl (1837–1909). The project is carried out as a cooperation between the philosophical institutes of Greifswald University, Germany and the University of Oslo, Norway.

While certainly the most complete bibliography of Hugh MacColl's works yet, this document represents a work in progress. A significant number of new entries have been added to the list in the last few years, and regular additions are to be expected for some time still. We have chosen to publish the bibliography in its present form because be believe the advantages of having it available outweigh the disadvantages of incompleteness. We will much appreciate responses from readers—notifications of errors in the list, and in particular of items that should be added to it. Updates will be published regularly.

In 1993, C. Thiel and V. Peckhaus of the Friedrich-Alexander University of Erlangen, Germany, provided to the MacColl project an extensive bibliography of MacColl's works. This work was in large part based on the research of A. Christie, one of their collaborators. We are highly grateful for this assistance.

The list of entries presented here is sorted by year of publication. We intend to add a version ordered by place of publication, in addition to more information on the sources. The database from which the list was prepared will also be made available, in BibT_EX format, possibly along with the programs used to prepare this document from the database.

This bibliography is published on the web site of *Nordic Journal of Philosophical Logic* (NJPL) in connection with the proceedings of the conference *Hugh MacColl and the Tradition of Logic*, held in Grefswald March 29–April 1, 1998. The proceedings, like all issues of NJPL, are provided free of charge. A main goal of the MacColl Project is the publication of a comprehensive critical edition, *Hugh MacColl's Writings on Logic, Philosophy, and Mathematics*. In the list, "Educational Times Reprints" abbreviates *Mathematical Questions with their solutions, From the "Educational Times*". The sources for MacColl's letters are: The Jevons Archive, The John Rylands University Library, University of Manchester; The Charles S. Peirce Papers, Harvard College Library, Houghton Library, Cambridge, Massachusetts; and Russell Archives, Hamilton, Ontario.
