Job description

A position of University lecturer (SKO 1009)/Senior lecturer (SKO 1198) in Latin is available at the Department of Philosophy, Classics, History of Art and Ideas, University of Oslo

The Department offers a BA- and MA-programme in Classics (Ancient Greek and Latin). The Classics division is also responsible for the one-year unit (*årsenhet*) in Ancient Culture. The <u>Classics Seminar</u> is an important meeting point for faculty and students. More information about the study programmes is available here.

Teaching duties can be in all areas of our studies programme but will primarily concern language acquisition/grammar and close reading subjects (both Latin prose and poetry) at the bachelor's level. Teaching is expected to be in Norwegian or another Scandinavian language, but there may be some need for English teaching as well. Applicants who, in addition to Latin, can document teaching competence in ancient Greek and / or ancient culture, will have an advantage.

The vacancy is a teaching position, with 75 % teaching and dissemination work, 19 % academic development work, and 6 % administration. The teaching will normally be at bachelor level. Within the normal duties and academic competence, the person appointed may also be directed to work outside his/her department. The appointment is made on condition that changes to the subject area and tasks may be determined by the employer.

Qualification requirements

Applicants must meet the following requirements:

- PhD degree in Latin or equivalent
- Teaching experience in Latin
- The successful candidate should be able to teachin Norwegian, Swedish or Danish from the moment of appointment
- Personal suitability and motivation for the position

In the evaluation of the applicants, emphasis will be placed on:

- Pedagogical qualifications and practice, mainly from universities or higher education institutions, see How to document your pedagogical skills
- Pedagogical qualifications, documented results from teaching and supervision, and ability to inspire students
- Experience in producing text books, compilations and lecture notes or experience in internet based teaching/flexible learning
- Interest and ability in leadership and administration

- Good teamwork skills and experience
- Professional competence and publication in the field
- Teaching experience in Ancient Greek and/or Classical civilization will be an advantage

The successful candidate who at the time of appointment cannot document basic teaching qualifications will be required to obtain such qualifications within a two year period.

The successful candidate should demonstrate mastery of both English and one of the Scandinavian languages as working languages. If an appointee is not fluent in a Scandinavian language, s/he is expected to reach proficiency equivalent to level B2 in the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) within two years. Within three years the appointee is expected to, in Norwegian, be able to actively participate in all functions the position may involve, including teaching. The Faculty of Humanities will aid and facilitate the appointee in reaching said proficiency.
